I am honored to announce that the U.S. Department of Education today has named *Helen Keller Middle School* a recipient of the 2011 Blue Ribbon Schools Award. This prestigious accolade recognizes our students' high level of achievement as measured by the Connecticut Mastery Test.

The Blue Ribbon Schools program is part of a larger U.S. Department of Education effort to identify and disseminate knowledge of best practices in school leadership and teaching. We are one of only *four* Connecticut public schools to receive this distinction, and among 255 public schools nationwide.

Our school will be honored at an awards ceremony in Washington, D.C. in November, where each Blue Ribbon School will receive a plaque and flag to signify its Blue Ribbon School status. Blue Ribbon Schools serve as models for other schools throughout the nation, and details of their achievements are shared on the U.S. Department of Education's website.

The Blue Ribbon Schools award sets a standard of excellence for all schools striving for the highest level of achievement. Each year since 1982, the U.S. Department of Education has sought out schools where students attain and maintain high academic goals. For many schools, a Blue Ribbon School flag waving overhead has become a mark of excellence, a symbol of quality recognized by everyone from parents to policymakers in thousands of communities. The Blue Ribbon Schools Program sets a high standard that should represent a goal for all schools that strive for excellence.
